# 264. <u>Draft Lease relating to the former Glyn Primary School, Lower</u> <u>Brynaman</u>

(i) The Chairperson, Cllr Geoff Moore, read out a detailed letter dated 21<sup>st</sup>

November 2018 he had received from Y Banwen, which was signed by the Chair, Company Secretary and Treasurer. A copy of the letter had been distributed to all members of the Council. In essence the letter informed Council that the Board of Y Banwen had unanimously decided not to agree to the lease offered by the Council. As a result the Board has decided to wind up Y Banwen and will be taking steps to formalize that decision over the next few days. They are also finalizing the accounts with the intention of returning the £30,000 provided by the Community Council. There was also the need to discuss return of keys, utilities and issues such as the future for the Men's Shed Group and the Brownies currently using the buildings.

Members were very disappointed with the Board's decision - it was stated that the Council had instructed an experienced solicitor and had followed his advice to the letter throughout.

### (ii) Letter of protest

The Chairperson read out a letter of protest received from a resident – this was duly noted.

#### (iii) Press Statement

The Chairperson produced a draft statement for issue to the press and media. This was agreed and, subject to any amendments, would appear in next week's Guardian and on the Council's website.

## (iii) Future plans for the Old Glyn School Site

After some discussion, it was agreed –

- that every effort be made to provide a Community Centre on the site, and it was further suggested -
- that the former primary school be sold off together with the land on this site.
- Members were invited to give some thought about a plan for the future of the site for further consideration in the next meeting of Council.
