

<u>Minutes of the Ordinary Meeting of the Council</u> <u>Held Via Zoom</u> <u>On Tuesday 13th April 2021 at 6.30pm</u>

Meeting started at 6.30pm

The Chair called for a two minute silence in honour of His Royal Highness the Prince Phillip, Duke of Edinburgh.

2. <u>Declarations of personal interest</u> (Agenda item No 2)

There were no new Declarations of personal interest.

3. <u>Chair's Announcements</u> (Agenda item No 3)

The Chair announced that after the publication of three available seats on GCG Community Council that these seats have been filled by the following people: Cllr. S. Reynolds for the Lower Brynamman ward, Colin Petrie for the Cwmgors ward, and Sarah Thomas for the Tairgwaith ward. All three candidates will be officially introduced at the next ordinary meeting once all the relevant paperwork has been received by the Clerk.

4. <u>Questions from the Public.</u> (Agenda item No 4)

There were no questions from the public.

5. <u>To receive any Updates from county council.</u> (Agenda item No 5)

Cllr. A. Woolcock was pleased to announce to the council that after the consultation held at NPTBC with regards to the proposed budget that County Council were able to reduce the original proposed raised Council tax figure of 3.75% to 2.75%. Cllr. A. Woolcock reported back to the council with regards to the letter sent to Nicola Pearce and the response received from the Coal Authority (previously circulated to all councillors). He noted that the Coal Authority state that they are aware of the potential changes in the existing adit outflows at Lower Brynamman and will be including Lower Brynamman in the site monitoring plans.

Cllr. S. Reynolds expressed how important it is to encourage members of the community to keep pushing for a cycle path/ walking route in Tairgwaith. She also stressed the importance of needing a safe route for cyclists and walkers to travel towards Pontardawe. Cllr. S. Reynolds informed the council that she has been working with Maerdy Youth and Organised Kaos. They have money for 6 months to engage with the young people hanging around in our parks and similar and involve them in more organised activities as these are allowed.
